In Alaska, Hawaii, New Jersey and Utah, the position of Lieutenant Governor is equivalent to that of Secretary of State. In Tennessee and West Virginia, the speaker of the Senate bears the statutory title of lieutenant governor. Five states, however, do not have a Lieutenant Governor position. Those states include: Maine, Arizona, Wyoming, New Hampshire and Oregon.
